2 Timothy 1

- 1) During this time of separation, who do you long to see so you can be encouraged in the faith? Take time to pray for that person like Paul prayed for Timothy. Take time to call and check in on him/her today.
- 2) How can you "fan into flame" specific gifts and callings God has placed on your life? Is your faith a glowing ember that has not yet reached its potential, or can your walk with God be described as a bright flame?
- 3) Reflect on verse 12. What sacrifices have you made in life because of your trust in this passage? What do you need to sacrifice if you really believe this passage?

2 Timothy 2

- 1) In verse 2, Paul encourages Timothy to devote himself to pouring into "reliable" people who will continue the work of ministry. Does this surprise you? What does this mean for your life?
- 2) Reflect on verses 3-7. Paul compares a faithful Christian's single-minded devotion to a soldier or a committed athlete. How does this relate to the Christian walk? How can you live this out better?
- 3) Reflect on verses 11-12.
- 4) Measure your life against verses 22-26.

2 Timothy 3

- 1) Do any of the sins in verses 2-5 describe you? If so, confess and repent. What does this mean about who you should allow close enough to influence you?
- 2) Paul's faithfulness to God can be seen clearly in his life. Can the same be said of you?
- 3) Do you have the kind of respect for the Bible described in verses 16-17. Do you see it as your fuel to equip you for every day of ministry? Why or why not?

2 Timothy 4

- 1) Do you see verses 1-4 playing out around us? How can you remain faithful in the midst of this as described in verses 2 and 5?
- 2) If you were to die today, would you be able to say what Paul says in verse 6? Reflect on the importance of living for the day we will stand before God.
- 3) When Paul had nothing else, God sustained him. Has this ever been true of your life? Is your faith alive enough in you that you could depend on God to pull you through difficult times?

John 1

- 1) Reflect on verses 4-5.
- 2) John does an excellent job of glorifying Jesus and minimizing himself. Can the same be said about of your life and ministry? Reflect on your motives in this.
- 3) Notice the way the disciples walked away from everything to follow Jesus. What do you still need to walk away from to go all in life the disciples?
